6. Youth Justice Booklet	Sarah Schindler	<p>At the end of March 2016 we completed the first printing of our new resource guide – <i>Navigating the Youth Justice and Mental Health Systems</i>. Sharon and Sarah interviewed professionals from police services and the justice system to create a step-by-step guide to the experience of a youth within the justice system as it is applied through the Youth Criminal Justice Act.</p> <p>It has been set up in the same format as the adult booklet but there are changes to the layout including the use of icons to update the appearance.
