Purpose

Rehabilitative Program Strategy

- Ministry mandate - care, custody and control of offenders aged 18 years and over in custody (up to two years less one day) or on community supervision (probation, parole and conditional sentence)
- Definition - “Core Rehabilitative Programs” are aligned with best practices in correctional research literature and target criminogenic factors related to: anger management, substance abuse, criminal thinking, sexual offending and domestic violence.
- Rehabilitative Programs
 - Five main topics – anger management, substance abuse, anti-criminal thinking, sexual offending, domestic violence
 - Various intensity levels (Life Skills, orientation, intensive) to fit with inmate/offender risks & operational needs

- SORP 2
- Basic Cognitive SORP
- SORP – Child Sexual Abuse Images (CSAI)

Risk Assessment for Sexual Offending

- Use of Static 99R, Stable 2007 and Acute 2007
- Dynamic Risk Assessment
- Tools developed for use by probation and parole officers

SORP CSAI Development

- Recognized a growth in this population
- Need for staff to have access to intervention
- Use of Effective Correctional Intervention research and practices to determine best approach
- Provides offenders with an opportunity to examine this behaviour, take responsibility and make necessary changes

SORP CSAI Timeline and Development

- Took one year from inception to training
- Used a Project Management approach
- Selected a team of subject experts from the field
- Conducted research
- Developed the program
- Pilot
- Training

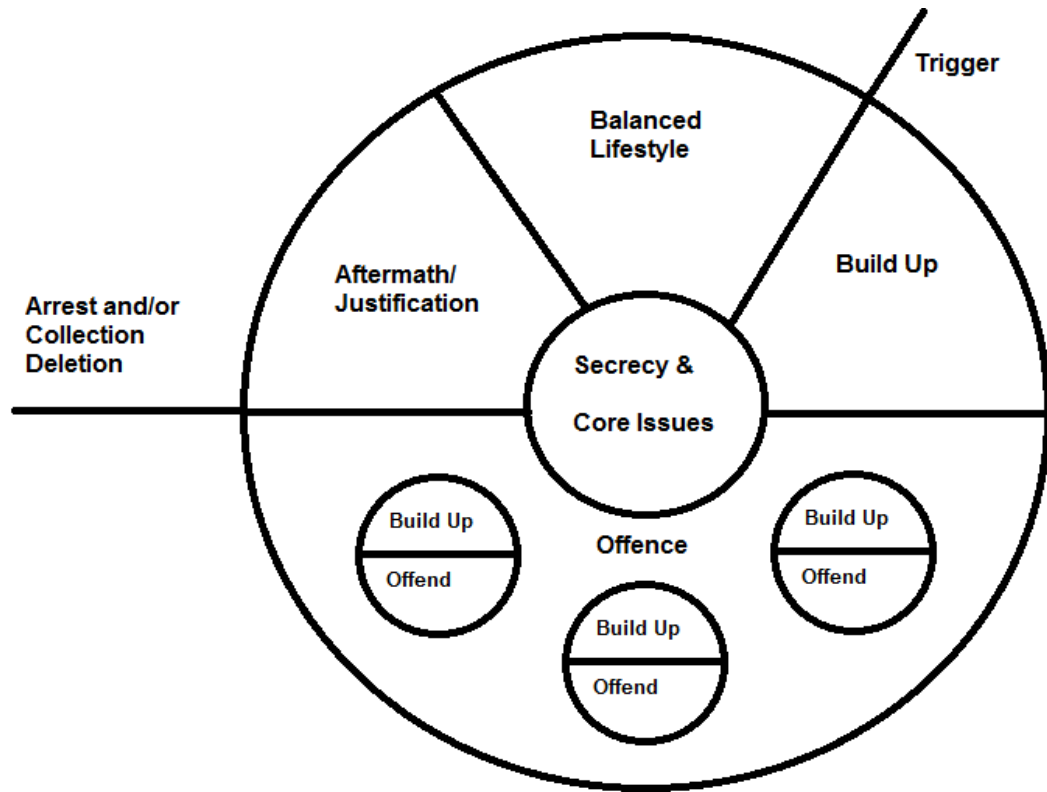
Program Accreditation

- Provisional Accreditation received in 2016
- Ongoing data collection
- Recidivism studies

The SORP – CSAI Program

- Eight sessions
- Uses a Cognitive Behavioural Therapy and Relapse Prevention model
- Structured Skill Building
- Success Plan
- One on one session

Session 1 – What are Child Sexual Abuse Images Skill – Thought Records	Session 2 – Impact of Child Sexual Abuse Images on the Victims
Session 3 – Balanced Lifestyle Phase Skill – Countering Risky Thoughts or Behaviours	Session 4 – Build Up Phase Skill – Coping Skills
Session 5 – Offence Phase and Aftermath Phase	Session 6 – Sexual Self-Regulation Skill – Positive Coping Strategies
Session 7 – Healthy Relationships Skill – Disclosing	Session 8 – Where Do I Go From Here? Skill – Progressive Muscle Relaxation

Child Pornography Offender Risk Assessment Tool - CPORT

- Developed by Drs. Michael Seto and Angela Eke
- Seven items, static risk assessment tool – examines areas such as age of offender, past history of sexual offending and the nature of the content found in the collection
- Pilot to commence in 2018 to bring this tool to Ontario
