#### 1.0 Call to Order, Introductions, Approval of Agenda & Additions

#### 2.0 Review and Approval of Previous Minutes: November 24, 2020

Minutes approved as circulated.

#### 2.1 Review of Action Items from Minutes

- a. Call for members for a working group on a drop in center where people could safely attend court or have access to a phone. It was noted that John Howard is doing a pilot project for hot spots for this purpose. Wendy McHenry with John Howard and Laura Baker from duty counsel is working on it. K. Cardinal will follow up with W. McHenry to see if there's an opportunity for a partnership and potential use of HSJCC resources. The committee would also like to hear from clients on where the ideal spot/area would be to attend court virtually. J. Garrow to follow up with Justice Perkins-McVey to get her thoughts.

# b. J. Garrow will follow up with The Royal's Learning and Development team on Mental Health First Aid training.

This training may be an option. There are two approved trainers to be able to deliver the course virtually. A workshop is being planned for March/April, Joan has requested one in March.

# 3.0 Presentation: "Navigating the Justice System with a Brain Injury" (M. Vigar ED, Brain Injury Society of Toronto)

- Presentation and video given by Melissa Vigar and Katie Manikas.
- There is a significant gap in knowledge and supports for people with brain injuries which causes a whole host of problems, ie. people tend to be incarcerated more, their sentences are harsher, right from the moment they interact with police and throughout the criminal justice system. In an effort to address this, a proposal was submitted to the law foundation of Ontario asking for some supports. The request was for funding for a support person to work with folks who have been diagnosed or who have a suspected brain injury to navigate the justice system. Unfortunately, what is funded are educational projects and not that kind of direct support. Funding was provided to produce an online tool kit that highlights the barriers that exist but also some tools and resources to be better equipped to navigate the system. This project ends in March but will continue the work. Another project has been started where funding for direct support has been received; social workers are currently being trained.
- Funding has been received to help people with the technology piece. Two community workers have been designated to support clients with this.

- Training is also done with police to help them recognize a client who may have an ABI.
- A French website/forms are being requested, which is reported to be a work in progress.

• There was a meeting held on January 13<sup>th</sup>. An idea was to provide some training for facilitators to work with clients who are getting CBT and DBT training. The feasibility of funding will need to be discussed.

#### e. Reintegration Trailer

• Jan Goatcher reached out to the folks at the trailer in Toronto and that person is willing to come to a meeting. There is a possibility that John Howard would have some money to support the trailer. The question is how OCDC will feel about it, so Jan reached out to Steve Ashdown, the superintendent, to get his thoughts. Steve was to discuss with his co-workers and get back to Jan. The thought was that it would be put on the back burner for now due to the current pandemic, as well as many vacant leadership positions. This project will be put on hold until OCDC can be on board.

#### f. Innovative Ways to Support Individuals with More Barriers During the Pandemic

#### 5.0 Reallocated Discretionary Funds

- There is some regional committee money available to be spent before the end of March. The provincial committee also has a surplus which has been divided between regional committees. The criteria is that it must be used for direct client impact only and spent by the end of March. Joan has received some direct requests for grocery tickets, OC transpo day pass cards, and anti-bugging kits. It was agreed the \$1750 from the provincial committee will be divided equally between Renfrew County, Ottawa, and SD&G/Prescott-Russell/Akwesasne.
- Johanne Renaud has developed a special project to spend extra funds. The intent of the project is to
  provide assistance to clients in an emergency situation for SD&G/Prescott-Russell/Akwesasne where
  emergency allowance would be provided for clients who meet certain criteria like release from court,
  release during winter without proper clothing or footwear, low income, potential of homelessness,
  financial difficulties, or at risk for criminalization. Funds could be used on taxis, pre-paid visa cards,
  winter coats, grocery cards.
- Tech support for clients was a recommendation.
- Joan will send an email for feedback and ideas on how to spend the money with a deadline of the middle of February to ensure it gets spent before the end of March.

#### 7.0 Roundtable

#### **Duty Counsel (S. Morris)**

- The general duty counsel number is (613) 238-7931 x 7001 that anyone can call for legal advice from legal aid.
- Courts are closed to all in person appearances, except for trials and some in custody appearances.

#### ABI (S. McKenna)

- The Developmental Services Ontario has offered a temporary wage enhancement for those who have a support worker from October 1<sup>st</sup> of last year to March 31<sup>st</sup> of this year.
- Clients have been struggling with the virtual options as well as having difficulty being on screen for a period of time.
- More calls are being received for medicinal CBD because of depression and anxiety.

#### LHIN (K. Barkley)

• Investments are beginning implementation.

#### **Probation & Parole (V. Quesnel)**

• Some video pilot projects are being worked on to do some remote reporting with clients.

# CMHA (L. St. Pierre)

• There have been challenges supporting clients through court matters during the lockdown. Some of the shelters are experiencing positive COVID cases. It will likely be discussed at the Mental Health Court core committee this afternoon.

# Salvation Army (G. Hudson)

 Legal Aid and the Ottawa Public Library have supplied chromebooks to the shelter to help clients access court.

# SD&G/Prescott-Russell/Akwesasne (J. Renaud)

- The local committee had a visit from the secretariat. There was training on member engagement and
  how the committee would like to move forward. Something that was identified was creating their own
  vision. To be worked on is creating less priorities and recruiting persons with lived experience.
- The committee is looking for people to sit on the release from custody project. The first meeting is next Monday. Johanne will bring an update to the next meeting.
