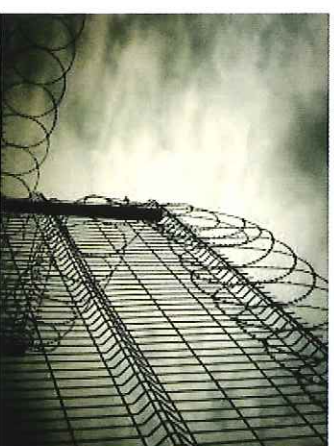

## Drugs Affecting Your Streets

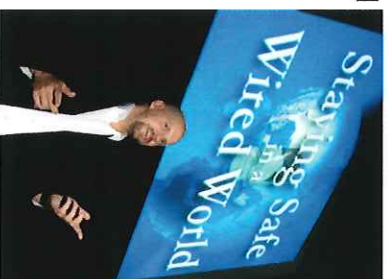
**Detective Sergeant, John Pearce, Sarnia**
