Welcome and Introductions

Review of January 9, 2020 Minutes

Presentation: Addressing the needs of youth with TBI in the Ontario Criminal Justice System: Creating an Implementation Process for TBI Screening with Gemma

- At least 50% of youth who have been charged with an offence have a documented history of TBI.
- Earlier and more effective means to assess and manage the consequences of TBI in people in conflict with the law or at risk, may lead to improved outcomes for individuals and for society.
- In Ontario, 1 in 5 middle-and high school students report having suffered at least one head injury sustaining a TBI
- High school students who reported a lifetime TBI were significantly more likely to report substance use.
- Younger children recover from TBI at a slower rate than adults due to the vulnerability of developing skills and lack of cerebral maturity. Can result in 'later developmental emergence of deficits'
- Kids with TBI are often misinterpreted as poor behaviour, lack of motivation.
- Present with impairments in language, cognitive communication, and social communication
- Can be barriers to understanding legal terms
- Can look like rudeness, defiance, inattention, bad attitude, carelessness etc....
- Screening and training are critical steps toward a justice system in addressing the needs of youth with TBI in Ontario, consistent with the goals of the Youth Justice Act.
- Example of the Devon County Council Speech and Language Therapy Services as part of the Offending Team was discussed.
- Benefits of considering language and communication reduced misunderstanding, confusion, stress, distress for people in custody, families, police officers etc....
- Pathway is designed to be individualized
- Gemma Creek, Lyn Turkstra and Catherine Wiseman-Hakes were thanked for an informative and insightful presentation.

Themes discussed: It was acknowledged that the assessment is the intervention which can be universal. Making documents and the legal process accessible.

Lunch and Learns

Domenica Dileo reported that there will be a Lunch N' Learn on March 9th on Affirming Trans and Non-Binary Gender Identities, at OCH Room 150 from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm.

March 26th there will be a Lunch N' Learn on Crystal Methamphetamine.
