Guest Speaker	<ul> <li>Dawn Hannah, Public Education Coordinator for Alzheimer Society of Durham Region provided an overview of Alzheimer Society of Durham Region with a Q&amp;A following.</li> <li>They have been providing services and supports since 1979 to the Community for ADRD (Alzheimer Disease Related Dementia).</li> <li>Respite program is underused.</li> <li>They also offer multi support programs/services.</li> <li>Public Education offers Virtual Dementia Tours. Offered 1x month. Simulation, experience of what it is like to live with Dementia, then a 10minute talk and debriefing with staff. This is free; however, tickets need to be booked through Eventbrite to confirm spot.</li> <li>They offer an 8-week program, "Taking Control of Our Lives", for people living with early dementia. It is a self-management education program that is client driven and focused.</li> <li>They have an art/music therapy program "Intergenerational Choir" in partnership with O'Neill High School (Oshawa) and students.</li> <li>"Blue Umbrella" program is offered as well. Look for the blue umbrella sticker on local business which indicates that staff of the business have taken extra training to help with customer service enhancement for people with dementia.</li> <li>6 out of 10 people with dementia go missing, often without warning. <a href="www.fiindyourwayontario.ca">www.fiindyourwayontario.ca</a> offers a special medic alert and safety planning for living safely in the community with dementia.</li> <li>Alzheimer Society also offers "First Link" for referring someone with dementia.</li> <li>New document "Canadian Charter of Right for People Living with Dementia"</li> </ul>

8. 2017-2018 Annual Provincial Report Updates	<ul> <li>Christina explained the report was submitted to Provincial prior to their June 1, 2018 deadline. This Annual Report reports on progress of Durham HSJCC Activities from the 2017-2018 Workplan.</li> <li>Christina also explained that Workplan I submitted to Provincial HSJCC in March of each year and the Annual Report is submitted by June 1<sup>st</sup> each year. Provincial HSJCC has these deadlines given they compile all Regional Reports and submits in one document to the LHIN. These reports are also Transfer Payment Agreement for funding for the HSJCCs.</li> <li>Christina also explained that some funding was returned from our Durham HSJCC this past fiscal year.
