1. Welcome and Introductions	Rob welcomed everyone as Chair. Members introduced themselves around the table. Welcome to New Member Courtney Hutson, Dual Diagnosis Justice Coordinator, Community Networks of Specialized Care – Central East.

3. Approval of Minutes from previous meeting – December 13, 2018.	Members reviewed and approved the minutes for the meeting held on December 13, 2018. <u>MOTION:</u> Approved meeting minutes.	
4. Provincial HSJCC Updates/Information	<ul> <li>The P-HSJCC elected Sara Dias, Executive Director of CMHA Kenora, as the new P-HSJCC Co-Chair.</li> <li>The new P-HSJCC Executive Committee has now been formed which will replace the previous Steering Committee. Members include the P-HSJCC Co-Chairs, 6 Regional HSJCC representatives, a CMHA Ontario representative and the Secretariat.</li> <li>The P-HSJCC has provided a letter of support to Traumatic Brain Injury and Criminalized Individuals Research Project to assist with recruiting clients and HSJCC members to conduct focus groups and engaging the network to evaluate knowledge translation products.</li> <li>Tasha reviewed updates to the format and appearance of the HSJCC website: Regional HSJCCs and Partner Organizations are encouraged to email Trevor with any documents/resources they would like uploaded to the site.</li> <li>Jean Hopkins provided an overview of CMHA Ontario's Drug Treatment Court (DTC) Initiative including a scan of DTCs across the province, their process, best practices and common challenges. The P-HSJCC is interested in partnering on this project to approach their municipalities about how they can leverage their work and assist in the community safety and well-being planning Ontario. There is an opportunity for Regional HSJCCs to approach their municipalities about how they can leverage their work and assist in the community safety and well-being planning process.</li> <li>Members are encouraged to contact Claudia, Tiana or Emily from the Public Safety Division if they wish to request a presentation in their region.</li> </ul>	



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	<ul> <li>Common strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT analysis), new initiatives related to human services and justice coordination, suggestions for additional support from the P-HSJCC and top issues and challenges.</li> <li>There were 8 top challenges identified by Regional/Local HSJCCs and Ex-officio partners: <ol> <li>Supportive/Affordable Housing</li> <li>Release from Custody/Discharge Issues</li> <li>Cross-sectoral collaboration and cooperation issues</li> <li>Clients with Complex Needs</li> <li>Emerging Trends in Substance Use Issues</li> <li>Specialized Populations (seniors, youth, Indigenous and racialized populations)</li> <li>Lack of Appropriate Resources</li> <li>Member Engagement.</li> </ol> </li> <li>The Secretariat facilitated a Priority Setting Exercise with the P-HSJCC to determine how they would like to address each of the 8 challenges in our 2019-2022 work plan.</li> <li>The Secretariat will work with the Executive Committee to develop a draft workplan to be presented at the March 2019 meeting.</li> </ul> <li>ACTION: Christina to provide Provincial with information from Durham Regional HSJCC to populate the new Provincial website with the committee's meetings and applicable information.</li> <li>Provincial Website is www.hsjcc.on.ca Committee Members are encouraged to visit the Provincial website for resources/webinars, information and knowledge exchange.</li>	
5. Mental Health 1 <sup>st</sup> Aid Training	<ul> <li>Rob stated as per our 2018 – 2019 Workplan Report goals we will be offering free Mental Health 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Training to Durham Regional HSJCC Members and their partnering professionals on March 19 &amp; 20, 2019. Lunch will also be included as part of the free training offer. 25 spots are available for the training.</li> </ul>

Christina will be the person that people register with for the training. Durham Mental Health Services (DMHS) will be providing the Trainers. Costs for materials/supplies will come from the HSJCC budget line.

10. Roundtable Updates	<ul> <li>Cindy stated they are waiting for budget and direction regarding investment in developmental services for movement forward with strategic direction and priorities. This will happen once the Provincial budget is released.</li> <li>Hospitals and LHINS are working collaborate and with uncertainty.</li> </ul>
	• Rob stated there is Dual Diagnosis funding coming as they are recognized as a priority population.



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	<ul> <li>Counselling issues are still present in Durham. More difficulty for clients to access these resources. Family Services, Catholic Family Services and Kerry's Place are declining any clients that have legal issues.</li> <li>Prior to John Howard Society (JHS) stopped providing counselling services they went to the community and asked if other partners were taking clients on. The answer was yes and now it is no.</li> <li>Michele stated that this presently is not a problem for Youth as there are services that are allocated specifically for youth to access for counselling.</li> </ul>
Guest Speaker for Upcoming Meetings.	<ul> <li>Members discussed that they would like a guest speaker presentation on how to access counselling in Durham Region and clarification on any exclusionary criteria.</li> <li><u>ACTION:</u> Christina to inquire with Mark Grant from Durham Region Family Services for a Guest Speaker to present at our March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Meeting.</li> </ul>
