The HSJCCs are a cooperative effort of the Ministries of the Attorney General, Children, Community and Social Services, the Solicitor General, and Health. A Regional committee with dedicated membership from Community Service Providers, Mental Health and Social Services and representation from each Ministries listed above.

	1. To provide a planning table to bring together service providers and/or system level decision-makers to find solutions to the problem of the criminalization of people with defined unique needs.
	2. To discuss and implement strategies using best practice to assist individuals who fall through gaps in service delivery as listed above
	3. To enhance discharge planning from the criminal justice system into the community and improve access to community resources.4. To improve linkages with community stakeholders.
	5. To work towards keeping the client/community safe along with respecting clients rights whenever possible.
