Confident in ability to get funding</p> <p>g. John Howard- JHS Crisis Coordinator has created 60 backpacks to be given to individuals released from CECC or those who need it in the community. Back packs are starter kits containing; hygiene supplies, hand sanitizer, face masks, winter gear, phone cards and more. Throughout the holidays JHS will respond 24/7 to the crisis line 705 879-6184 and helping those in need.</p> <p>h. Employment Homelessness: Adult Protective Services/OPP- People can meet in the Canopy Support Services office again</p> <p>i. PARN- Lora is at the Haliburton pharmacy once a week, will be monthly during the winter months. PARN has two types of Vaginal Hygiene Kits for distribution. 1) yeast issues 2) bladder issues Services</p> <p>j. Education- Students are working from home, so vulnerable parents/ grandparents are not at risk of covid. Teachers are preparing for any changes with covid so teachers will be ready.</p> <p>k. YWCA- has personal hygiene kits available. Everyone is working mostly by phone and video conference Platform. On Call Health to launch in January 2021. Back in July the office was struck by lighting. All electronics should be fixed by now. Not a lot of use of the outside emergency phone.</p> <p>l. Mental Health- Very busy, positive police involved-notify of needy households under stress. Helping people connect electronically, for court sessions. Safe Beds is still operating</p> <p>m. Brain Injury(clients 18yrs-65yrs) – has personal hygiene kits available</p>
