d) Round Table Updates Provincial/Regional/Local  All Agencies are doing a tremendous job during covid-19 times. SIRCH has freezer meals available in Haliburton at the Silver Maple Hotel for those staying there, as well as at Parkside. No emergency accommodations in Tory Hill- usually go to Bancroft. ROTORAC-Youth involved in Rotary Club  Mary Sisson lives in Cardiff and has offered delivery, as needed in that area.  In Haliburton there is the pressure of an increased population from other regions  Andrew is moving to a newly created role, a CMHA/OPP Partnership. He'll be strictly working on cases with Police involvement, following up with Mental Health and Financial Assistance. His current role with Four County Crisis will be filled eventually.  a. Point In Time — Youth Hub update: Connectivity Campaign to raise funding for phones with data for one year for students age 18yrs and under. United Way and local donors have donated \$90,000.  The Youth Hub has a shower-let Mary know and she can make an appointment for your client to use the shower. (one person at a time). A full Time Nurse Practitioner named Lindsay reports in March. She is very experienced and is originally from Haliburton.  Ads in the paper for hiring Mental Health and Addictions Clinician (Permanent Full Time), Peer Support Worker (Permanent Full Time), Care Coordinator (Permanent Full Time)  The Youth Hub will have new official hours which will include a couple of evenings and Saturdays.  b. Community Living/Employment- People in need of employment supports are divided into three streams. Stream A, B, C, with A really needing no support and C has higher needs against barriers. Job Quest/Community Living can do an intake for people in stream c – people who require more support-	All	10min

- diagnosed disability or self diagnosed disability. Through Flemming, OW refers to vccs in Lindsay and Flemming crew in Haliburton. If on OW, Life Stabilization could be worked into an employment role. If on ODSP or self-identify can be helped by job quest.

She will be responsible for guiding the whole organization forward to accomplish our mission of addressing the impacts of food-& energy-insecurity within Highlands East & the County of Haliburton, respectively.
