Youth Hub - Point In Time- Mary S- The hub will begin to reach out to community partners to open up their monthly operational meetings on the 2<sup>n</sup> Wednesday of the month. The Haliburton youth Hub has been named the third busiest hub, yet the smallest! They continue to see very complex cases and also have outgrown their current space. They are renting space @ 235 Highland St above Dr. Smollen's dental office. The Hub is losing their men health and substance worker Madison who is moving on, however she will stay on part time Tues &amp; Thurs till March. The volunteer tutor (Sylvie) continues to be busy. Mary will be bringing Jenn Dale the Hub's Care Coordinator to next month's meeting.</li> <li>c. Heatbank/FoodNetwork- Rachel –Toys were delivered to 134 Kids over Christmas/ 30,000 lbs. of food were distributed. They continue to be busy, and are gearing up for the upcoming CVITP season. There will be volunteer working in Minden this year.</li> <li>d. CMHA-Todd/ Hannah/ Theresa – Todd -Expressed concerns with the Minden Court. Cases continue to have a long backlog, no security in the building. There has been some talk about if some of the concerns do not improve, they will have to move court back to Lindsay.</li> </ul>	tal	20min Total

**Hannah** - Haliburton county now has the equivalent of 2.5 Brief Mental Health workers. The four counties have 12 in total. They are now accepting community partner referrals; she will send the info to Tina for distribution **Theresa** – The road ahead is hoping to in the near future hold "walk in clinics" They are also providing couples counselling.

- e. John Howard-Taylor/ Arianna/ Liam JHS has partnered with the health unit for completion of surveys on substance abuse for those over 16 years of age within the past six months. Each survey could possibly take between 30-60 minutes and pays cash \$25. Taylor will send poster to Tina for distribution Arianna Working on Community learning webinars (101's) Working on a poster, once complete she will forward to Tina for distribution. She is still offering naloxone/ anti stigma training to anyone who is interested. Liam will be starting the training for CVITP
- **f. YWCA- Nycole/ Christina** The YWCA is hiring for two positions #1 an outreach worker #2 clinical therapist. They continue to be extremely busy. As an outcome from the Campbellford inquiry, there were 32 detailed recommendations to prevent such a horrific event from happening again, as a result Peterborough has deemed intimate Partner Violence an Epidemic, and it is expected that Haliburton County will be following suite. The YWCA will be partnering with HHHS for ongoing education for ED staff.
- g. **CSWB- Sue** –CSWB is meeting again in February and Jennifer West-Burns from HHHS is joining the committee representing healthcare. There will also be a focus on housing and homelessness. The accessibility committee in inviting people with lived experience to come speak to any barriers they might be experiencing in the county. May 1<sup>st</sup> is First Responder's Day. York Region has given permission to use their template for a one stop information hub on the county's website. There continues to be Community Mobile Outreach in the county multiple times a month. Haliburton County Public Library is opening a Dorset Branch Library. Aging together as a Community conference is taking place on January 27<sup>th</sup> at the Pinestone. There are three various grant

opportunities available, Tina will forward information to committee. County	
staff continue to undergo relevant training.	
<b>h. CKL- Emily Bosnell</b> – CKL is currently hiring for two more life stabilization	
workers. She briefed the group on "Participation Benefits" which could be up	
to \$500 per calendar year client/situation depending.
