• Presentation by Kyle Graham: McMaster Children's Hospital

The Child and Youth Mental Health Program opened 7 years ago, and operates 22 inpatient beds at McMaster Children's Hospital. More than 2,000 patients are seen per year. They provide intensive mental health services for children, youth and families in the central south region of Ontario. Patients in the Child and Youth Mental Health Program are seen up until the age of 18, and adjustments are made to the program depending upon the patients' age. One of the biggest challenges faced by the program is where patients get discharged to. Consent issues with parents of patients can also be a challenge to manage.

Others felt that this should not be a big concern because we discuss cases only within a specific framework, and try to identify and streamline system issues that cause barriers for clients.

Additions to the Agenda

o DSO Intakes at Barrett Centre- Kristen Emery & Lisa Whittingham

The DSO is having a walk-in clinic at the Barrett Centre on the second Friday every month. This opportunity will allow clients to see Rose Kay from DSO Intake department in person for:

- Initial introduction to DSO
- Referrals for psychometric assessments to determine eligibility for developmental services. Consent would need to be provided to initiate this referral and a brief intake would be completed with Rose on site for eligibility for referrals. An IQ of 70-75 may meet criteria
- Information about developmental services available
- Info about general community services that may be helpful

 Direction about reconnecting with DSO (if already connected) and providing their Access Coordinator's name and number

These walk-in clinics started in Niagara, and are now up to a full day there. Clients may bring a support person with them to the clinic.

Rose will be at the Barrett Centre between 1 – 3 p.m. on:

- July 8
- August 12
- September 9

- October 14
- November 11
- December 9

It is a first-come-first-serve basis so it's best that clients show up sooner rather than later to be sure they are seen, otherwise they may be asked to come back next month or call DSO.
