9) Community Justice Centres	 An update was provided on the Community Justice Centres initiative: Updates were given from each of the locations in Kenora, London and Toronto's Moss Park. The Ministry has gathered all the information they feel they need. The report to cabinet is only around framework and liability as there has been no discussion around location or funding. It was noted that the Regional and Local HSJCCs should be focusing on resourcing questions if a CJC was to come to their communities. 		
10) CKE Committee Update	 CKE Committee Updates were provided: Something of ongoing interest is having an e-forum or something similar Next newsletter will be out by the end of November which will provide highlights from the conference Transition to the new website is complete – site is working well so far Trevor urged HSJCC Chairs and partners to send over their updates and core documents so we can include them on the website.
