5)	MOU Update	Uppala informed the group that MOUs exist between CMHA Ontario and the HSJCC. CMHA provides in-kind support, and maintains a working relationship with CAMH. This arrangement is regularly reviewed, and was updated in October. The intent is to share these updates in the spirit of transparency.				
6)	16/17 Mid year workplan update	Joseph noted that the meeting package contains the submission to the MOHLTC on 30 October 2016. Updated within the workplan were the outputs in 25 discreet activities. Nothing new, which has not been discussed at this table, was added; discussions resulting in workplan updates were simply included in the submission. There are four categories, as described in the document.				
7)	Conference Planning Update	Gord informed the committee that the conference is a year away. We will be drafting a letter to send to the Ministries, hoping to ensure attendance of key decision makers. Action item: letter to ministries.				
8)	CKE Committee	Trevor reported that approximately 75 participants attend each webinar. In the new year, themed webinar series will be conducted – addictions will be the first one. The other two will be racialized/indigenous populations and justice involved youth. We conducted the first Member Engagement Plan meeting, and a survey was sent out with some questions to regional and local chairs. Joseph reported the website will be ready to go live in December of 2016.

9) Workplan Items	Uppala presented on the adaptation of Mental Health Works to address Operational Stress Injury.				
a. OSI	Ryan reported that Mental Health Works has been a fabulous program within LAO, which has contributed to greater awareness and discussion on the issue amongst lawyers.				
	Katie relayed the experience of a juror who ended up taking the MAG to court due to her trial experiences. She asked Uppala if it would be possible to partner with other agencies using this as a model.				
	Trevor concurred, noting that we should look at our mandate and how it is worded. There may be room for a partnership with CMHA Ontario.				
	Chris noted that we must be careful about endorsing a particular program; this is not likely something that the HSJCC should be doing. We can communicate availability, but should stay away from endorsements.				
	Lisa noted that it would be fine to share that the Mental Health Works program is offering a discount to HSJCC Network members, as the HSJCC has shared similar program offerings in the past. HSJCC would not be promoting the program, rather promoting the discount that is offered as a benefit to the members.

11) Consultation with the MOHLTC: Ontario's Opioid Strategy	Sean Court attended the PHSJCC meeting in order to hear from membership on the Strategy. Farlon asked a question about treatment, noting that Suboxone is effective for withdrawal management but also for long-term pain management. Sean replied that the lower back strategy is meant to aid in the development of programs to ensure we can walk back prescription rates in a manner that is responsible.				
	Chris asked whether the membership was experiencing interactions between drugs and mental health concerns in the court system. Kenora responded that the drug and mental health courts often connect within their district. Peterborough houses a 'concurrent disorders court', which addresses complex care issues and how they intersect within the justice system.				
	Ryan asked whether psychiatric physicians will receive updated training on chronic pain issues. The answer was that the belief is the entire College will undergo updated training.				
	The desire to integrate HSJCC programs and projects with the Strategy has resulted in the following actions items: Action Item: Opioid Crisis will be the Issue Management Session for January Action Item: MOHLTC to attend that session to answer further questions.

Sara responded that they have spoken to the stakeholders involved and there seems to be reticence amongst all to own the problem. Joan Garrow responded that often this becomes a question of risk – their group will pick up and transport to hospital if there is low risk. Chris Higgins noted that they are mapping the dimensions of this problem, noting the inherent complexity. HSJCC could very well address classes of issues, rather than individual case management. Individual issues may be highlighted to shine some light on the problem were the HSJCC to decide to contact the Police Commission within MCSCS.
