Situation Tables have been mobilized and commenced meetings in Marathon and Greenstone. A partnership was established with the Red Lake Situation Table. The Northwest Regional Centre of Responsibility (COR) currently supports five Situation Tables in the Northwest region. As a result, 8 regional partners from the health, justice, education and social service sectors became members of the Northwest Regional COR.

(COR) meeting and potential opportunities for linkages with the Community Safety and Well-Being component of this legislation will be discussed. approximately 16service providers from the health, justice,education and social service sectors in Nipigon.

The Northwest Regional Centre of Responsibility (COR) hosted A Day of Learning with Maya Chacaby on March 28th for 160 delegates across the Northwest region. This full-day event focused on Indigenous cultural resilience and trauma informed practice. Maya brought participants through 100,000 years of history all the way to present day, and made the important linkage to trauma informed practice when making connections to the people our service providers serve.

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
