 2019/2020 Year End Finances 2020-2021 P-HSJCC Work plan 2020-2021 Regional and Local Work plans 	Year End Budget Totals: Given the evolving nature of COVID-19, we will be spending less than projected but well within the expectations for the year. 2020-2021 P-HSJCC Work plan: Joseph ran through all items on the 2020-2021 P-HSJCC work plan with P-HSJCC members. This represents the minimum of what we are committed to, but we are flexible to respond to upcoming issues and changes to our sector. All of the financials will be shared regularly with Executive committee as well as progress updates. MOTION: Voting members motioned to approve the 2020-2021 P-HSJCC work plan. Candace provided an update on the 2020-2021 work planning cycle: Given the current state, we have extended the deadlines for chairs to submit their regional and local work plans for another two weeks. There was a reminder to chairs to send the total number of funds their region receives from the LHIN as the Secretariat has not surveyed how funds are allocated across the network since 2015. There was also a reminder to chairs to send in their membership lists which would include name, position, organization and email address.
