3) Approval of 2021- 2022 P-HSJCC Work	The Secretariat presented an update on the 2021-2022 P-HSJCC Work plan:

	 This prompted a conversation with the P-HSJCC Co-Chairs and Secretariat around the structure and accountability of committees across the network. The Secretariat noted that the number of local committees have changed over time based on a change in needs for regions and their communities. There is a small portion of the Regional committee's budgets that are allocated to local committees. However, it is up to the region to decide how to allocate these funds. The Regional HSJCCs receive funds directly from the former LHINs. It was noted that local committees can help address service issues. We need to ensure that local table issues are still being addressed at the Regional table. Members want to ensure the Timiskaming area needs are met where possible. Members suggested the Secretariat reach out to agencies that were previously involved in this committee in the fall to see if there is an engagement opportunity to restart the committee. There was a suggestion to see if there's a Community Safety table in that area. There may be similar people a part of that table that used to be part of the local Timiskaming HSJCC table. There was also a suggestion to find out whether an Ontario Health Team will be covering the Timiskaming area.
5) Discussion re: MCCSS's Announcement on the Closure of Youth Justice Centres	 Christine updated members on MCCSS's announcement of the closure of Youth Justice Centres: On March 1, 2021, the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services announced the closure of 26 youth justice centres, many of which were in northern Ontario. MCCSS explained that because of an 81% reduction of youth in custody since 2004-2005, facilities were empty most of the year. The closures follow recommendations from the Auditor General and will result in \$39.9 million in cost-savings annually. Youth were moved from the closing facilities to other centres, some of which were many hundreds of kilometers away from their home communities. According to media reports, family members were not informed that the youth would be moving. First Nations communities were not consulted during the government's decision-making process, even though many of the impacted youth are Indigenous. The Secretariat asked if the P-HSJCC table should engage with MCCSS on this issue: Members felt that there should be consultation with written submission and flagging core themes including the effects of mental health supports and experience of the families. There was a suggestion to repurpose some of the facilities in the submission. Need to know what other mental health and addiction support services will be made available for youth

6) Discussion re: Feedback on Proposed Exemptions to the Police Records Check Reform Act	Christine led a discussion on the Ministry of the Solicitor General's proposed exemptions to the Police Records Check Reform Act: • The Ministry of the Solicitor General requested feedback on proposed exemptions to the Police Record Check Reform Act, 2015 (PRCRA). • The HSJCC Secretariat was not made aware of the public request for feedback until it was too close to the deadline. • The proposed exemptions would allow some non-conviction records, including mental health records that are created during a police interaction or apprehension under the Mental Health Act, to be shared with certain employment sectors • This creates an unfair barrier for people living with mental health and addictions issues who are seeking certain employment or volunteer opportunities. • Although the Ministry requested formal submissions by March 12, 2021, there are opportunities for the P-HSJCC to consult with the ministry on this topic. The P-HSJCC's key messages to the Ministry could include: • The P-HSJCC was consulted when the PRCRA was drafted and successfully advocated for mental health records to be restricted from police record checks, with limited exceptions. • The 2011 Provincial HSJCC Police and Mental Health Report states that mental health police records can be a useful tool for police officers to share information about a client's history to help respond to a mental health or addictions crisis. • Mental health police records should only be accessible to police officers so that they can better respond to mental health crisis situations. This information should not be released to potential employers, landlords, border enforcement officers, the public or anyone else. • Disclosing mental health police records increases negative stereotypes and reinforces misperceptions about the relationship between violence and mental health.

	Mental health police records reinforce these negative stereotypes and contribute to the stigma, discrimination and social exclusion of people who have experienced a mental health or addictions- related crisis.	
	The P-HSJCC would like to engage on this issue through a submission:	
	 Members noted that that mental health records might put the client at risk and follow them through the justice system. People may not be seeking support because of this. This may cause more risk to individuals. Members raised concerns about the inadequate length of time to provide feedback on ministry consultations, especially considering the size of our network. May wish to flag this for the ministry within our submission. Members recommended including a key message around the importance of cross-sectoral collaboration. Members also raised effects COVID-19 has on mental health and the short and long terms this will have on individuals. 	
	ACTION: Secretariat to draft a submission providing feedback on the Police Records Check Reform Act proposed exemptions and send to voting members for approval.
