<p><b>4) Update re: Ministry of Solicitor General Community Reintegration Planning Tables Partnership (CRPT) with P-HSJCC</b></p>	<p>The Secretariat announced that they will be removing this item from the September 20<sup>th</sup> meeting agenda and will share internal communications with P-HSJCC members soon.</p>
<p><b>5) Discussion re: Release of Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) Framework and Toolkit and Public Policy Forum</b></p>	<p>CMHA Policy Analyst Erin Paquette provided members with a recap of where we are at with the release of the MCRT Framework and Toolkit, as well as discussing preliminary thoughts around a public policy forum that included:</p> <p><b>Background:</b></p> <p>In 2019, the Provincial HSJCC began a province-wide project to identify existing mobile crisis response teams and innovative practices. Mobile crisis response teams typically involve a police officer and a mental health and addictions service provider, such as a social worker or nurse who respond together to a mental health and/or addictions related crisis.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The general purpose of mobile crisis response teams is to de-escalate situations where an individual may be experiencing a mental health, neurodevelopmental, and/or addictions crisis. In addition, these teams aim to:</li> <li>○ Improve client outcomes by providing community assessment to determine links to appropriate community services</li> <li>○ Divert individuals from unnecessary criminal justice system involvement and reduce pressures on the court and correctional systems</li> <li>○ Mitigate the impact on police resources in relation to mental health and addictions crisis response</li> <li>○ Improve individual and/or caregiver experiences</li> <li>○ Decrease stigma of individuals living with mental health and/or addictions issues</li> <li>○ Build and maintain effective partnerships between police services, health care providers and community.</li> </ul>

	<p>Following up on this provincial project, a provincial working group was struck, led by the Ontario Provincial Police and the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Ontario, in partnership with the Ministries of Health and the Solicitor General, the Provincial HSJCC, and with support from the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police and the Ontario Hospitals Association.</p> <p>The purpose of the working group was to better understand the role, structure, and function of mobile crisis response teams in Ontario.</p> <p>The Mobile Crisis Response Teams Provincial Working Group (see Appendix A) guided the development of a provincial framework and toolkit to provide police services, hospitals and community mental health and addictions organizations with a roadmap to establish effective mobile crisis response teams locally in their communities. <i>Developing Mobile Crisis Response Teams: A Framework for Ontario</i> outlines best practices and recommendations for the development and evaluation of mobile crisis response teams while remaining flexible to the needs of local communities.</p> <p>The accompanying toolkit, <i>Tools for Developing Mobile Crisis Response Teams in Ontario</i>, provides templates and resources communities can use to establish or enhance their own mobile crisis response team(s). These resources were finalized in August 2022 and can now be launched.</p> <p>Preparation for the Launch of the Framework &amp; Toolkit</p> <p>The Co-Chairs of the Provincial Working Group are currently working together to prepare for the launch of the framework and toolkit.</p> <p>A communications strategy and associated communications package are in development.</p> <p>In September 2022, the partner organizations will be contacting representatives from the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of the Solicitor General, the Ontario Hospital Association, the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police, and the Provincial Co-Chairs of the HSJCC to seek their endorsement or support for the Framework and Toolkit.</p> <p>A launch event will be held in Fall 2022 and a public policy forum will follow.</p> <p><b>Comments/Feedback:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No comments or feedback from members</li> </ul>

<b>8) Discussion re: Future of P-HSJCC Meetings</b>	<p>Secretariat Director of Justice Candace Vena led a discussion regarding the future of P-HSJCC Meetings.</p> <p><b>Background:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Currently there are funds set aside in the budget for P-HSJCC in person and/or hybrid meetings for January and March of 2023. Aside from this fiscal, the P-HSJCC will need to have a preliminary discussion as to the overall approach to P-HSJCC meetings moving forward.</li> <li>• P-HSJCC members are supportive of virtual meetings for the remainder of fiscal, however the P-HSJCC will explore the possibility of an annual hybrid approach for the May 2023 meeting.</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Comments/Feedback:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trevor noted that there was great value in meeting in person but also noted it may not be suitable for all P-HSJCC members</li> <li>• Trevor noted that there would be added cost as there would be a need to accommodate a greater number of members than the previous space was able to provide along with the technology that would be needed.</li> <li>• Secretariat Director of Justice Candace Vena noted that there could be the potential to pilot a meeting that would accommodate a hybrid model with the \$8k that was allocated for in person meetings.</li> <li>• South West HSJCC Regional Co-Chair Erika noted in the Zoom chat box that a hybrid model would be great and provided a link to a virtual meeting platform provider named <a href="#">Owl Labs</a></li> <li>• Toronto HSJCC Regional Co-Chair Susan inquired what can be done to enhance the experience of the P-HSJCC meetings, both in person and online.</li> <li>• Secretariat Director of Justice Candace Vena flagged that meeting time would have to be extended and we would have to ask members who are attending to stay online longer than the current meeting times.</li> <li>• Co-Chair Joan Nandlal noted that virtual meetings allow more people to attend and will allow greater attendance. She noted that she has found hybrid meetings to be not as efficient as virtual meeting. Joan recommended that the \$8k that was allocated to in-person meeting could be used by the provincial committee in other areas of need.</li> <li>• North West HSJCC representative Jenny feels that the virtual meetings are more efficient and recommended that one annual P-HSJCC meeting be held in person.</li> <li>• Co-Chair Joan suggested that May would be good time for an annual in-person P-HSJCC meeting because it would be at the end of the previous fiscal year and at the start of new fiscal year prior to summer vacations, etc.</li> <li>• Secretariat Director of Justice Candace made note that if members committed to having virtual meetings for the remainder of the 2022-2023 fiscal that the 8k budgeted for in person meetings would have to be reallocated to be used by the end of the 2022-2023 fiscal and that proposals on what to do with those funds would need to be brought forward to the P-HSJCC Executive Committee for approval.</li> <li>• <b>MOTION:</b> Motion to support remaining virtual P-HSJCC meetings for the remainder of 2022-2023 fiscal year was motioned to move forward by North West Regional HSJCC representative Jenny, seconded by South West HSJCC Regional representative Trevor and was carried through by show of hands by P-HSJCC members using the raised hand function in the Zoom virtual platform.</li> </ul>
