Echo our member organizations’ request for fair wages for their services providers. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Request based on feedback from P-HSJCC members, research on the availability of mental health and substance use programs across the health care sector as well as arrest for individuals with mental health and substance abuse issues. • Increase Housing Supply and Supports throughout the Housing Continuum: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. <p>Highlights from the MH&A Justice Services Inventory</p>	<p>Dianna Cochrane (MOH) and Candace Vena (CMHA Ontario) presented highlights from their joint initiative on the MH&A Justice Services Inventory.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In March 2023, the Ministry of Health entered into an agreement with CMHA Ontario to develop a project to create an inventory of mental health and substance use services in Ontario, with a special focus on services for justice-involved populations (i.e., anyone who has been charged with an offence, has a criminal record, has been incarcerated, or is at risk of becoming justice involved). • The inventory provides a fulsome point-in-time reference of the mental health and substance use services that exist for justice-involved populations in Ontario. • The inventory includes programs by region, program types, target groups, funding sources, and key junctures. The inventory would be housed on the HSJCC website. • CMHA Ontario retained the services of DPRCA Canada and the John Howard Society of Ontario as consultants on the project. The consultants conducted the research required to build this inventory of services. • The inventory was completed in October 2023 and was shared with all regional and local HSJCC chairs for review and feedback in November 2023. • The key junctures reflect the coordination protocols included in the founding document for the HSJCC, A Provincial Strategy to Coordinate Human Services and Criminal Justice Systems in Ontario (1997). These junctures follow the service pathway for individuals who become justice-involved. • Highlights presented from the inventory included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Count of programs in each Juncture in Ontario ➤ Justice Programs - Funding Source ➤ Case Management Programs (including definition) ➤ Intervention Programs (including definition) ➤ Programs Accepting Children/Youth Age 12+ ➤ Programs that have Medical or Healthcare Component ➤ Programs Geared Towards a Specific Cultural Group
