The program had its first graduate on January 8, 2015. • Crisis Intervention Team of Oxford, an Ontario Provincial Police, Oxford County mental health & addictions team has scheduled one officer on every shift to be the lead for crisis interactions with Oxford County residents. Officers can access offices of the Canadian Mental Health Association across Oxford County (including after hours) with individuals who need services, but not hospital care. OPP are utilizing Ontario Telemedicine connections to CMHA Crisis staff after hours. The OPP Oxford has grown the program out of the CIT learning funded by HSJCC. • Oxford County HSJCC has no meeting scheduled until June 2015 <p>Huron Perth HSJCC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The committee continues to meet on a minimum 4 times per year • Our membership continues to grow and we are pleased to have consistent and committed participation from all of our members. We are welcoming the Superintendent of the Stratford Jail to our Committee and he will be joining us at our February meeting. This will bring our total membership to 22 individuals. • Agenda items are developed in collaboration with all members of the HP HSJCC and significant time is dedicated to a review of case scenarios and process reviews between providers and police services • The Superintendent of the Jail will be a valuable member of our committee as our hospitals are caring for a number of individuals under Police custody and this will assist us in educating our staff/patients/families of the process and will support discussion regarding our practices in hospital when individuals with MH and Addiction needs are in hospital and police custody. • Work completed in 2014-2015 • In November 2014 we completed our 3rd annual Police Training with Sarah Burtenshaw. This now brings the total officers trained to 103. As

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		<p>a community we are seeing increased communication and coordination of care of individuals with mental health and addiction needs between our MH and Addiction Staff, Local Police and Probation services.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The committee provided recommendations to one of our local Schedule I hospital that assisted in decision making regarding responsibilities of in house security officers and use of handcuffs. The recommendations have been adopted by hospital and this responsibility will remain with our local police services • A letter of understanding between local police and Schedule I hospital with respect to mobile and Emergency Department response is being finalized with Chief of Emergency Medicine, Psychiatry, EMS and Program Director for Mental Health. This will be reviewed with HP HSJCC. • Our committee will be completing our work plan for 2015-2016 at the February meeting. <p>Elgin</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The HJSCC has continued to provide education through Lunch and Learn sessions at the courthouse to the judicial system and the community agencies involved who provide treatment to the individuals involved in the justice system. • Ongoing education; Crisis Intervention Training to HJSCC to local police services, Aylmer, St. Thomas, OPP, and security at STEGH, as well as neighboring County in Oxford. • In the HJSCC the “Court Committee” has made significant steps to facilitate with the judicial system a plan for a “Elgin Therapeutic Court” with an anticipate start date of Spring 2015; formal date to be discussed at the next meeting upcoming in Feb 2015. LHSC and HSJCC are trying to put into place a more efficient hand over protocol to schedule 1 facilities. • City of London Homeless Prevention – O2R – pilot project launched on November 1/14 – for individuals with judicial order to reside orders. SLCS in partnership with Salvation Army - Centre of Hope and Salvation Army – Justice Services have set up a housing first program around these individuals. • Addiction Services – have gone through a restructuring in the past few months. Have a problem gambling and internet gaming with a walk in intakes on Monday’s and Thursday’s; have just launched Mental Health Addiction in French language. • Crisis Centre -Stabilization Space Project– rolled out slowly with controlled growth. Currently only running on weekends. Individuals are usually discharged back to family or set up with a Transitional Case Manager. At this time most referrals have been from the hospital. • Dale Brain Institute – Due to the need they are now doing justice case management. Now working on small pilot to take referrals directly from EMDC and have some really good success stories and has been very successful. • Women’s Community House – Received a large grant from London Community Foundation. Opened up a Centre at 101 Wellington Rd. which is a counselling and referral centre for crisis calls and walk-in services. Allows them to focus on the women and children and allows other staff to deal with the crisis lines. Outcome has been good. <p>SLCS – St. Lawrence Centre Project – coordinating access for individuals come out of that Centre. Are able to track them in a more meaningful way when they are released</p>
