1)	Welcome and Introductions	Katie Almond welcomed the attendees to the Provincial HSJCC meeting of Sep 20, 2016.
2)	Review of agenda for Sep 20, 2016	The Provincial HSJCC membership reviewed the agenda for the meeting of Sep 20, 2016. MOTION: Joan Garrow moved to approve the agenda of Sep 20, 2016, Gord Boyd seconded.
3)	Review/Approval of the minutes of May 17, 2016	The Provincial HSJCC membership reviewed the minutes for the meeting of Ma7 17, 2016. Sara dias is from the north west, not north east.

5)	HSJCC Network Annual Reports	Joseph Szamuhel informed the PHSJCC that the annual report was submitted on 30 June 2016 to the MOHLTC and LHIN regional mental health leads. He provided details on the outputs and outcomes, along with some details on the current financial status. He noted that a high level summary is included in the meeting package. Annual reports for the regions were submitted in August. For members wishing to have an overview of what was submitted they can consult the webinar held at the end of June 2016.
6)	P-HSJCC 2017 Conference Planning Committee Update	Gord Boyd began by thanking everyone for their help to-date. He noted that the budget was discussed at the Steering Committee meeting, which was approved, and the speakers are being contacted. A 'save-the-date' message will be following shortly for all potential attendees. He argued that due to the Provincial nature of the conference, a sponsorship committee should be struck in order to represent each region. This includes the group reaching out to their ministerial contacts in order to ensure attendance. It was mentioned that there were challenges in scheduling the Minister to appear at the last conference. It was agreed that it would be helpful for the PHSJCC Co-Chairs to draft a letter for sending to partner ministries to help arrange for a Minister to attend the 2017 conference .

Three items were discussed:</li> <li>ACTION ITEM 2.</li> <li>a) A member engagement committee should be struck, which would enable us to better retain active membership. <ul> <li>Don Roth, Gord Boyd, Terry McGurk, Sharon Pitawanakwat, Trevor Tymchuk, and Jennifer Gravelle all volunteered to form the committee.</li> <li>ACTION ITEM 3.</li> </ul> </li> <li>b) The new issue management plan was discussed via power point. It was requested that codes of conduct be forwarded to the secretariat so that they could be used as rubrics for a provincial code of conduct. The issue management plan is to be reflected in the terms of reference. PHSJCC meetings will now contain themes in order to enable discussion of regional issues.</li> <li>It was agreed that the issue for discussion at November's PHSJCC meeting will be that of transportation for accused persons requiring psychiatric assessments between correctional and psychiatric facilities. Secretariat staff will provide a background briefing note on the issue to committee members and committee members will consult with their regional committees and partner ministries/organizations to inform the discussion in November. ACTION ITEM 4.</li> <li>c) The policy consultation procedure was discussed. While traditionally the HSJCC has not responded to media requests, the issue management plan will now be utilized for all such requests.</li> </ul>					
9) Presentation from the Core Services Task Group of the Mental Health and Addictions Leadership Advisory Council	Camille Quenneville introduced how the council was formed and its composition. Gail Czukar spoke on the Core Services Task Group, and the work done to date. She stressed that availability and accessibility are key deliverables of the sector, and noted the difference between the two terms. She discussed the eight categories of the core services framework. In a discussion following the presentation, it was pointed out that persons incarcerated in Federal correctional institutions do not have the same access to a standard of care as provincial inmates. It was asked where justice would be included in the Core Services framework. It was also asked how core services will be provided to the extremely marginalized; linkages do not currently exist for this

	<ul> <li>population after release from custody and many barriers to access exist among client populations that are the focus of HSJCCs.</li> <li>Gail responded that the focus of the core services is on programming currently provided by the LHINs. She noted that this could be included in an appendix, making a distinction between federal and provincially supervised services.</li> <li>She also noted that the current scope of the project does not discuss barriers to access. The intent is to map the current core offerings, and from there identify barriers in separate project. She noted that it would be useful for the HSJCC to submit a definition of the barriers that exist for their clients accessing core services.</li> </ul>				
10) Presentation from the Mental Health and Addictions Branch of the Strategic Policy and Planning Division, Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care	Marg Connor introduced the strategy, and went over some key indicators that the MOHLTC utilize for the problematization of mental health and addictions programming. A key result of the work done to-date is the identification of the added benefit that PWLE have serving on leadership and advisory councils. Some anticipated 2016 council recommendations were touched on briefly. Her presentation will be forwarded to the group. ACTION ITEM 6. It was agreed that it would be helpful for the MOHLTC to present at the 2017 PHSJCC conference perhaps with a panel of relevant directors. The conference planning committee will be reaching out to them accordingly in the future.				
11) Presentation from the Evidence Exchange Network for Mental Health and Addictions (EENet)	Nandini Saxena discussed the role that EENet plays within the HSJCC, and its ability to support the network. The presentation discussed: 1) the provincial support program; 2) role of EENet; 3) definition of Knowledge Exchange (KE); and 4) typical knowledge exchange activities. It was pointed out that EENet has access to other datasets with some correlation to the sector; for example, police services datasets. Nandini suggested that the membership can approach EENet with putting together a survey in aid of the member engagement plan.
