

## Revised Proposal Request: January 7, 2021

At its January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 HSJCC meeting, members approved that \$3000 be allocated from the 2020-2021 fiscal budget to provide assistance to clients of the HSJCC SDG and PR and Akwesasne local membership who present themselves in an emergency situation and do not have resources to meet the emergency needs such as transportation, meal and seasonal appropriate clothing.

The funds will be distributed equally amount HSJCC member organizations who request to receive funds for their clients.

Member organizations will be responsible for the management of these funds as intended in the proposal and will provide a report with supporting receipts prior to March 31, 2021 and forwarded to Joanne Ledoux-Moshonas, HSJCC Co-chair at moshonasj@cmha-east.on.ca.

## Special Project Funding Request Proposal:

## INTENT

To provide assistance to clients in an emergency situation for clients of the HSJCC SDG and PR and Akwesasne local membership agencies and services who do not have resources to meet the emergency needs such as transportation, meal and seasonal appropriate clothing.

An emergency allowance may be provided to a client when meeting the following criteria:

- Released from court
- Released during winter without proper clothing and footwear
- Low Income
- Potential for homelessness
- Financial difficulties
- or at risk of criminalization

The funds may be allocated for the following purchases:

- Taxi or transportation vouchers from court to the individuals residence
- Purchase of a meal while waiting at court or after the court appearance
- Purchase of seasonal appropriate clothing such as footwear, hats, gloves, winter coat etc...
- Prepaid gift cards of \$25.00 each (groceries, personal toiletries, etc...)
- Emergencies that may arise after being released from court
- Other needs identified by the support worker & client
