Review & Approval of Previous Minutes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Not applicable, as this is the first official HSJCC Simcoe-Muskoka Network Committee meeting. The last HSJCC meeting was a special Member Engagement Lunch & Learn Event on June 7th. The results of this meeting were shared with all today. 	
Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For today's education piece; co-chairs, Mary and Jean-Marc discussed reasons for amalgamating the 5 local and regional HSJCC groups, work plans, annual report, agenda format, budget, sign in sheets, food catering, membership, education, projects. Due to the fiscal year being April 1st to March 31st, the Lunch & Learn Event which was held on June 7th will be considered the first meeting of this current fiscal year. Three Provincial HSJCC employees attended and facilitated the Lunch & Learn Event. 31 members attended the event, 26 completed the survey. 88% were quite satisfied with this event in general. 96% would recommend this type of event again. best practice, HSJCC Local and Regional Co Chairs, Jean Marc Pelot and Mary Martin made the decision to amalgamate as one group in an attempt to increase and promote HSJCC members' awareness across local communities and the region. We are now using Member Engagement Best Practice Approach. Many other areas within the province have already begun meeting as amalgamated.

- Key themes as identified during our meeting in June included: collaboration across sectors, improving linkages and communication between local and regional HSJCC's, having educational opportunities, introducing new members, prioritizing round table updates and accountability. Those who attended felt the Vision Statements were accurate. Identification of gaps from all was helpful.
- Quarterly Meetings will be scheduled in advance for September, December, March and June in order to enhance each member's agenda planning convenience. Notices will be sent via Outlook Calendar Invitation as well as emailed. Please ensure current email address is on file and updated as needed.
- If a member can no longer attend these HSJCC meetings; please consider finding an alternate who can attend in your stead.
- We can provide letter of support for special projects/initiatives upon request & review
- 2018-19 Budget – Approximately \$8,000 currently available for this year's local projects. Total Forensic budget is hosted by CMHA SC and has an annual budget of \$17,777 allocated for HSJCC. Fiscal year is April 1 – March 31. Projects must be completed/funded within current fiscal year only.
- Suggested setting up working groups within the local committee groups as needed, in order to work on special projects.
- Also suggested establishing breakout committee groups: Knowledge Exchange committee, Member Engagement Committee (MEC to prepare new member Welcome kit, review membership and invite new members)
- Discussion if remote access to meetings will be available ie. Via telephone especially for December/March meetings when weather may prevent attendance; this option will likely not be available at this time
- Regional Conference held biannually usually costs \$10,000-\$12,000
- Regional Conference scheduled for May 16th, 2019 and will be paid from the 2019-20 fiscal budget

<p>Provincial HSJCC Update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● HSJCC website is an excellent resource tool at www.hsjcc.on.ca ● Provincial HSJCC employs four staff, known as the Secretariat; the rest of the PHSJCC members are volunteers ● Introduction of HSJCC to be sent to the new Ontario Premier ● Regional Co-Chairs, Mary and Jean-Marc attended the PHSJCC meeting in Toronto on Sept 18th, "Visioning Day" with break out groups. Discussion regarding roles of the HSCCC, goals, memberships, etc... A consultant was hired to assist with this day. Results are currently being tabulated. ● Provincial Conference November 6-8, 2019 ● Community Justice Centres anticipated pilot most likely in 2020 This was intended to roll out in 2018 but has been delayed ● MCSCS Correction Reform Bill 6 was passed. New mental health policy coming into effect now

 - Hiring for case management and crisis position (35hrs)
 - Child and youth assessments at GBGH (Crisis staff) when 12-15 year old are formed

 - Running Getting Ahead Program. Looking for allies for the Circle Program (forming relationships to help people get out of poverty)

 - There is a new worker Chelsea Rowland
- Amy/Taylor, Enahtig
 - No residential programs right now
 - Accepted to transform Vasey location into 90 day Treatment program for youth and school on site, 3 co-ed beds, 1 bed for transgender
 - Program development, expansions ongoing
 - “healing the whole family unit” is behind the program expansions
 - Trauma informed
 - Both lodges will be up and running in January 2019
- Jamie, Enahtig
 - Challenges re: housing following release from CNCC for example – wait for residential treatment, high cost of rent, return to problematic environments
- Tanis, Enahtig
 - Caseload increasing, new people
 - Reconnecting people with their culture
 - In the position for 7 months
- Beth, Ontario Works
 - 1.5% increase to OW
 - Working on direct deposit issues
 - Preparing for possible mail strike
- Jenaya, John Howard Society
 - Goes into the jail as well
 - New program “Helping Youth and Parents Plan Positively”
 - Targeting intergenerational criminality
- Jenny, CFHT
 - New programs – IASP – 4IASP
 - Psychotherapists shared with other agencies – 12 week CBT based program
 - Trans Clinic – trans program with Nurse Practitioner, Peer Support Worker and a Psychotherapist and Doctor attached to the program; clients do not need a family doctor, self referrals accepted
 - 3.5 months waitlist for mental health programming

 - New rent supplement spots
