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

Mental Illness

"It Affects Someone You Know"

- Depression is 3rd most common disease worldwide
- 4 of top 10 disabilities worldwide
- 450 million people worldwide
- 1 in 5 Canadians experience mental health issues





Youth and Mental Health Illnesses "Early Intervention is the Key"

- 20% of Ontario children has a mental health challenge
- Many with 2 or more mental health illnesses
- Younger children being diagnosed



Here In York Region "Close To Home"

- 200,000 residents experience mental health illness
- 2% of the population living in York Region suffers from some form of *permanent* mental health illness

Stigmatization "Discrimination Hurts"

- Barriers to employment
- Poverty
- Homelessness
- Risk of victimization
- Conflict with the law

- Children's Mental Health
- Returning Veterans
- Aging population
- Concurrent disorders
- Dual diagnosis


Impact on York Regional Police

- In 2012 York Regional Police responded to:
 - 2157 calls for emotionally disturbed persons
 - 1243 suicide attempt calls

Mental Health Support Team "We are better together"

- Partnership between Police and YSSN – Crisis Response Program
- Team consists of an officer and a crisis worker





Mental Health Support Team

"Providing Support to the Community"

- Response for persons 16 years of age and up
- M.H.S.T. provides:
 - support
 - resource information
 - assessments
 - advocates for subject
 - education



MHST

 Team consists of 2 full time plain clothes officers and 18 alternate officers as well as 3 full time crisis workers and 5 alternates to fill in for vacation and training requirements

 In 2012 the team responded to 2954 calls for service
